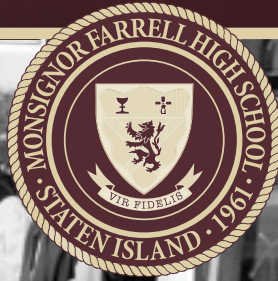

Great Things are happening here!

From the proud sendoff of the Class of 2025 to the incredible momentum carrying us into the arrival of over 230 young Lions in the Class of 2029 this fall, one thing is unmistakably clear: Great things are happening at Monsignor Farrell High School. ***And they're happening because of you.***

Over the past ten years, the generosity and engagement of Monsignor Farrell alumni have increased exponentially. Of our approximately 13,500 alumni, annual donor participation has grown from under 1.5% to over 11%. That means the number of alumni making annual contributions to support the school has risen from about 200 to more than 1,500—a tremendous show of faith and commitment to the mission of developing the Vir Fidelis, the Faithful Man.

Together, through the Strengthen the Legacy Capital Campaign, we've secured over \$10 million in gifts and pledges. Whether it's a million-dollar leadership gift or a faithful \$15 a month in our 15 for Farrell program, every

cent has made—and continues to make—a powerful impact.

This generosity has allowed us to reimagine and rebuild our campus, elevate our academic offerings, and ensure our young men are equipped to meet modern-day challenges with confidence, clarity, and faith.

One of our most significant accomplishments to date—and one of the most appreciated by our students and faculty alike—is the historic achievement of air-conditioning every single classroom on campus. For the first time in our school's history, every young man at Farrell can now learn in a comfortable, climate-controlled, and healthy environment. This was no small task—it was a massive undertaking made possible by alumni like you who understand the importance of investing in the daily well-being of our Faithful Men.

The community is noticing. At events across Staten Island,

I'm continuously humbled by the resounding praise for Monsignor Farrell. There's a word-on-the-street buzz—people proudly point to Farrell as the gold standard of high school education on Staten Island.

Academic & Athletic Excellence

Our newly launched academic institutes, societies, and studios have become bridges—connecting our successful and professional alumni back to campus, offering mentorship and modeling leadership for the next generation of *Vir Fidelis*. These efforts have paved the way for authentic experiential learning—offering our students opportunities to explore the world while deepening their faith and broadening their perspective.

In recent years, Farrell students have journeyed to Italy, France, Ireland, and England, and will soon head to

Spain. Domestically, our travels have brought us to Albany, Washington, D.C., and Boston—and through our Marine Biology Society, to Key Largo, St. Thomas & St. John, and soon, to La Paz, Mexico.

Academic excellence continues to thrive at Monsignor Farrell. Vincenzo “Enzo” Rapacciuolo '25 was awarded the prestigious Petrides Award for Excellence in Math and Science, a borough-wide honor open to all Staten Island high schools. This is the second year in a row that a Farrell student has received the award. Brian Lahari '24, now a student at Cornell University, won the award in 2024.

Eric Rodriguez '25 earned the coveted Varsity Club Award, Staten Island's highest honor for all-around student-athletes. These two young Lions—and the academic culture that shaped them—prove that Monsignor Farrell is producing not only Faithful Men, but future leaders of intellect, character, and impact. You'll learn more about these two impressive young men later in this issue.

At home, we've raised the bar in athletics and student health. Our Performance & Wellness Center and the new JAG Physical Therapy Athletic Training Center—with a full-time trainer on staff—are transforming the experience of our student-athletes, giving them the tools to compete safely and excel proudly.

It is no coincidence that since these investments, Monsignor Farrell teams have captured seven varsity championship titles at both the city and state levels. Most recently, our wrestling and lacrosse teams brought home the New York City and state titles—a reflection of our commitment to excellence, both on and off the field.

And yet, while we've accomplished so

much together—there is still more that we can do.

Eye to the Future

As we look to the future, and with the continued active support and generosity of our alumni, we are poised to make even more history.

Next up: bringing to life our ***“Field of Dreams”***—the first regulation baseball field on campus. This will be a generational game-changer—but we need our alumni to help make this dream a reality (see page 22 for details).

Through it all, our tradition has not changed. The spirit of the Farrell Brotherhood remains as strong as ever—perhaps best captured in the moment when Matteo Renna '27 returned to the Lions' Den after a lengthy battle with illness and a kidney transplant. His classmates didn't just welcome him back—they lifted him with an outpouring of love that defined what it means to be a Farrell Man.

Through all our growth, our Catholic identity and mission remain our cornerstone. We proudly and unapologetically stand for God and country, both literally and figuratively.

From the Principal

The magazine you are holding as you read this letter provides a colorful snapshot of our present campus, which for four years served as your “home away from home”. Our building is 64 years old and those of you who have reached or are approaching that milestone know that age is a constant battle to overcome the effects of gravity, entropy, and oxidation.

The days of Monsignor Bergin repairing a burst pipe in the link area with a TAB can and duct tape are over. Maintenance and more importantly modernization of the facility come at a significant cost, and it is through the generosity of our alumni that we are able to provide a safe and comfortable environment for our students, faculty, and staff.

So let’s take a look at some of the changes which have taken place since you were at 2900 Amboy Road, while we continue to uphold the mission, values, and traditions of Monsignor Farrell High School.



THE BEST is Yet to Come

Commitment to Catholic Education

Some of you remember when more than half of our faculty consisted of priests and brothers. It is a sign of the times that our staff now has only one brother, one sister, and one priest who serves as a school chaplain. We are very fortunate that we have been able to attract qualified lay faculty, both men and women, who continue to provide the quality Catholic education for which Farrell is renowned.

Liturgical life and pastoral outreach continue to be at the forefront of everything we do. We celebrate weekly Monday Mass and First Friday Mass in the chapel, school-wide Mass of the Holy Spirit, Ash Wednesday and Holy Day Masses, daily prayer, Advent and Lenten confessions, grade level retreats and Stations of the Cross and Rosary during Lent.

Our Teaching the Christian Message (TCM) program features approximately 30 of our seniors who go to parishes on Staten Island to teach CCD classes, bringing the Christian Message to students who attend public elementary and junior high schools.

Technology in the Classroom

The inevitable switch to technology in the classroom was expedited by the COVID pandemic and the transition to remote learning in 2020.

Presently, every classroom and lab have at least one state-of-the-art SMART Board connected to campus-wide WiFi.

Every student is issued a Lenovo laptop/tablet to use for note taking, homework and testing where appropriate. Students and younger faculty members made the adjustment to this technology faster than Luddites like me. I still miss the old blackboard and tossing a piece of chalk halfway across the Chem Lab into a beaker on the front desklegendary! And don’t worry AP Chem alums...*I still insist on a 5 subject college-ruled notebook* (to supplement the laptop) which will be filled with only AP Chem notes and problems by the end of the year.

And speaking of labs, all of our science labs have all been stripped down to the bare bones, re-outfitted, modernized, and restocked with all the latest equipment to provide our young men the science education they deserve. Once again, we could not have accomplished this without alumni support.

College Preparatory Curriculum

We pride ourselves on the fact that so many of our alumni come back to tell us how well prepared they are/were for college.

A contributing factor is that we presently have 25 courses in our curriculum, taught by our own faculty, which are available for AP and/or college credit.

It is the rare student who graduates from Farrell without having accrued some credits toward his future degree.

The majority graduate with at least one year of college courses on their transcript. With the cost of college spiraling out of control, this offers a significant savings toward paying for their degree.

And what colleges are they attending? Our Department of College Advisement and Guidance prides itself on making sure that each graduate is placed in the post secondary school which is right for him and his family. I realize it is a small sample size, but in the photo above, the four students (now alumni) are enrolled in Wagner (PA program), Duke, Vassar, and Sacred Heart.

Our Current Faithful Men

The members of our student body today reflect the diversity of Staten Island and are genuinely bright and eager young men who appreciate a Farrell education.

As it was in your time, their families sacrifice to pay our tuition because they want the faith-based education and foundation Farrell provides.

Best Days Ahead

A heartfelt thanks to all of you who have strengthened our legacy with your support.

I encourage all alumni who haven’t gotten on board to join us as we continue to do great things at Monsignor Farrell High School.

As the President and CEO of JAG Physical Therapy, John's generous contribution has endowed Farrell with a premier facility dedicated to the health and performance of our student-athletes.

While this event officially marked the opening of the facility, it has already been serving Monsignor Farrell's student-athletes, providing them with top-tier care, injury prevention, and rehabilitation services.

The center has become an integral part of the school's commitment to student wellness,

ensuring that our athletes can train, compete, and recover with the highest level of support and expertise.

THE PERFORMANCE & WELLNESS CENTER

Coupled with the JAG Physical Therapy Athletic Training Center, the Performance & Wellness Center signifies our commitment to the health, growth, and development of our students.

Officially opened in the spring of 2022, the 3,600 square foot facility features equipment and technology found in professional sports facilities.

"The Performance & Wellness Center is utilized for fitness, physical education, rehabilitation, and sports performance, which are integral to the growth and development of my Monsignor Farrell brothers," said John Gallucci, who holds a master's degree in sports science and athletic training from Long Island University, and both a master's and doctorate in physical therapy from Dominican College.

The Performance & Wellness Center is under the direction of Rob Schmidt '12 (pictured), Farrell's Assistant Director of Athletics for Student Wellness and Performance.

A specialist in the field of exercise and human performance, Rob earned his bachelor's degree in sports science from Long Island University, Brooklyn.

He has been mentored by some of the most highly respected professionals in the field of strength and conditioning, having worked at prestigious colleges and universities such as Ball State University (Indiana), the University of Alabama, the University of South Carolina, and Defiance College (Ohio).

Volunteer as a mentor. Host a



Chairman of the Board

After graduating from Farrell in 1974, Larry Unrein earned a Bachelor of Science degree in accounting and psychology from SUNY Plattsburgh, and his MBA from the University of Pennsylvania Wharton School of Business.

In 1979, he joined the Investment Management Corporation of AT&T. In his 18 years with the company, Larry worked in equity, fixed income, and private markets, overseeing what was, at the time, the largest corporate pension fund in the world.

After leaving AT&T in 1997, he joined the investment and wealth management arm of JPMorgan, a multi-trillion-dollar global investment company, with the idea of starting a private equity business. In 23 years, Larry took the company to over \$30 billion in assets under management, establishing a leading global investment platform, primarily for institutional clients such as pension funds, insurance companies, foundations, and endowments. For most of his time at JP Morgan, Larry chaired the investment committee for the entire company, as well as serving on the firm's management committee.

During his career, Larry was a member of over 60 external corporate and advisory boards, serving as chair or committee chair on a number of them. He retired from JPMorgan in 2021.

Larry remains deeply rooted in his Farrell heritage. Appointed as a member of the Monsignor Farrell Board of Trustees in 2019, today he honors his alma mater as Chairman of the Board (since 2024), championing initiatives that modernize the campus and enrich the educational experience for his younger Farrell brothers. He has returned to Farrell on numerous occasions to share his time and talent as a guest lecturer in our academic institutes.

Through his stewardship, Farrell's legacy—and its commitment to forming Faithful Men—continues to thrive.

Strengthen the Legacy Capital Campaign

The ongoing Strengthen the Legacy Capital Campaign is a comprehensive fundraising campaign aimed at funding capital improvements, endowment building, and annual fund support for Monsignor Farrell High School.

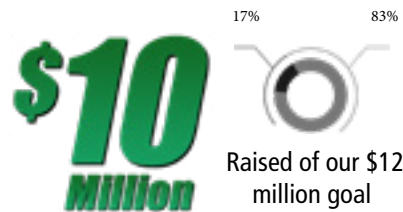

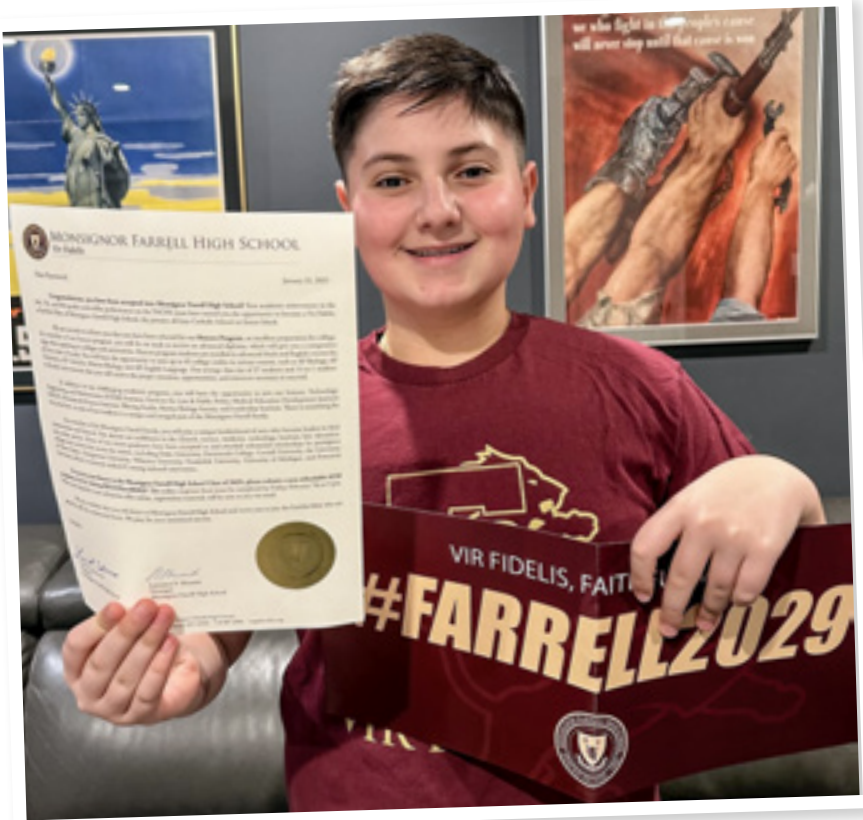

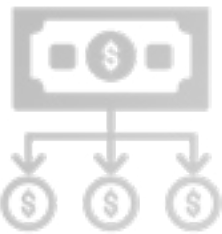

Salutatorian Vincenzo Rapacciuolo scored a *near-perfect* 1550 out of 1600 on the SAT Exam.

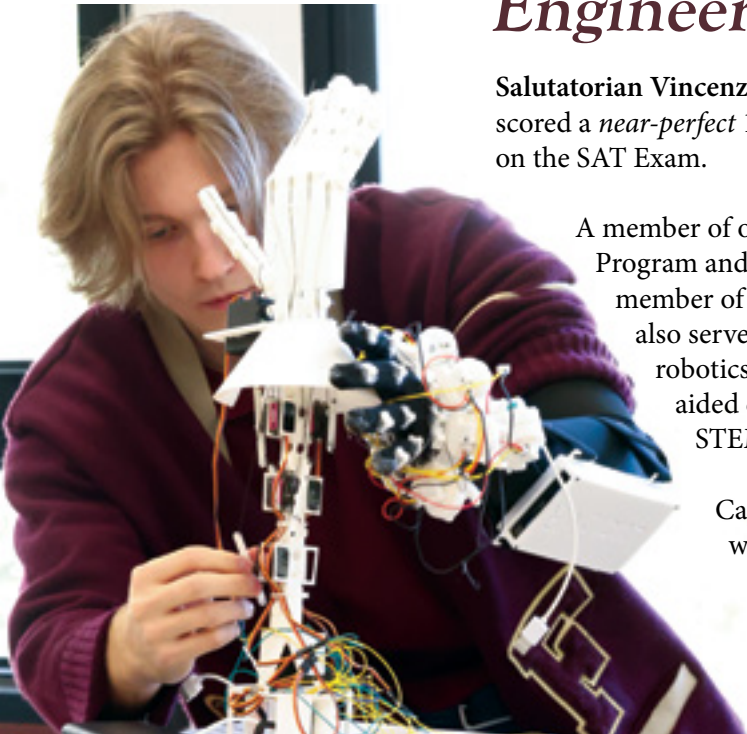
A member of our Scholar's Program and a three-year member of NHS, "Enzo" also served as head of robotics and computer aided design in our STEM Institute.

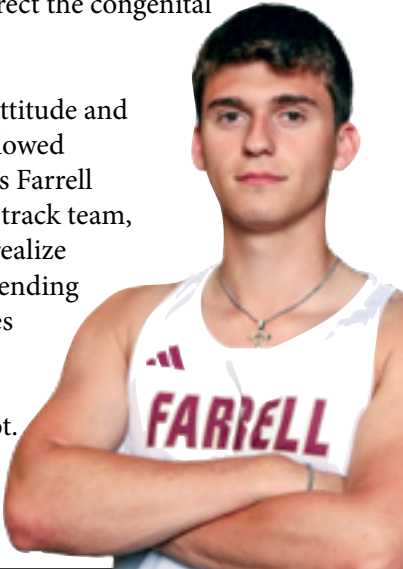

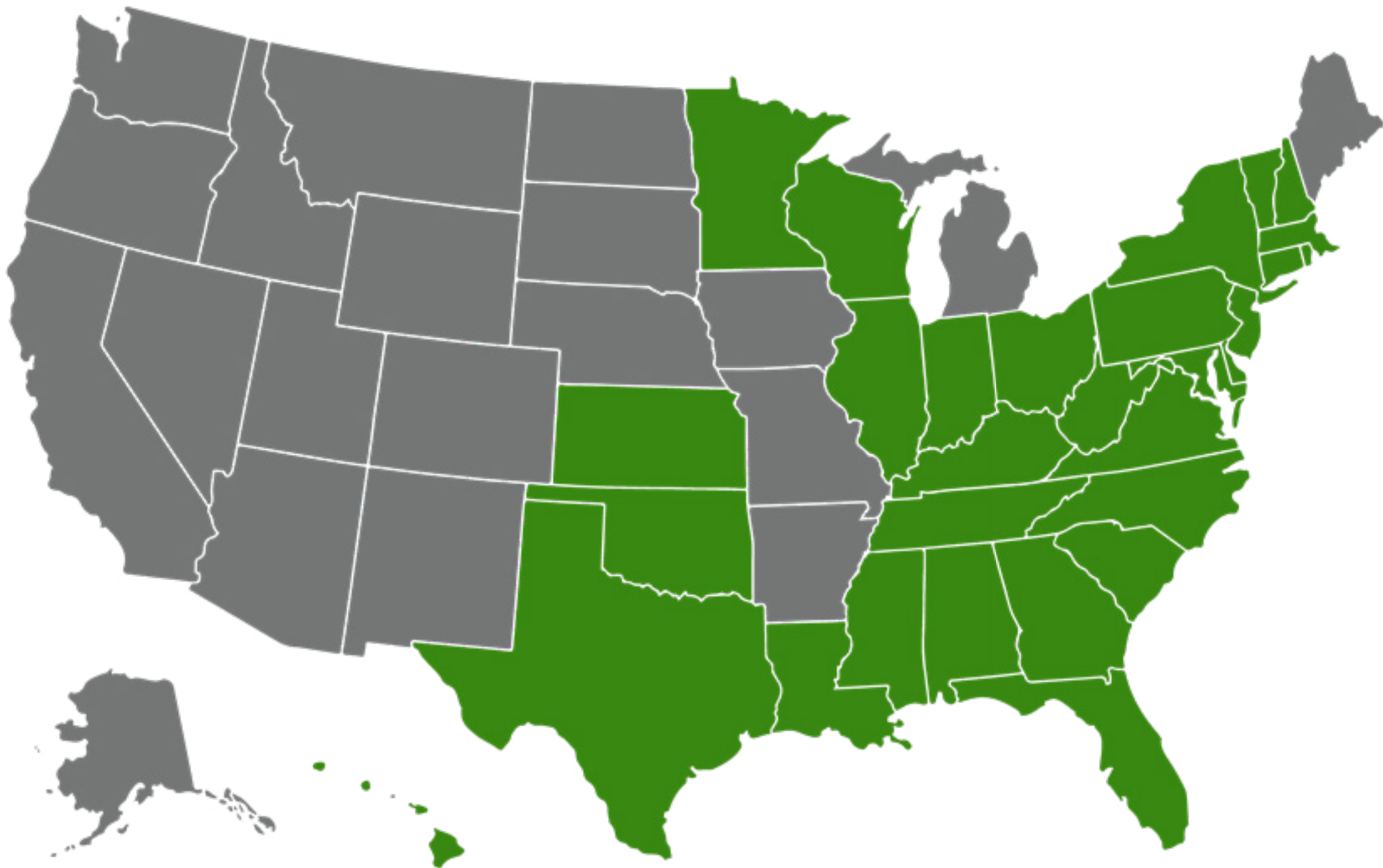

“One of the Best Days of My Life”

Nine Faithful Men Received Confirmation, Including Dalton Lake '27, Who Received All Three Sacraments of Initiation

On the sacred Feast of the Ascension, Monsignor Farrell High School experienced a moment of profound spiritual significance as nine students were fully initiated into the Catholic Church—with eight receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation, and one student receiving the full Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.

The special school-wide Mass was

concelebrated by Bishop Edmund Whalen '76, and Monsignor Farrell Chaplain Father Jeff Pomeisl. Held in the school gymnasium and attended by the entire student body, faculty, and staff, it was a moving and joy-filled liturgy, one that powerfully embodied the brotherhood and faith that define the Farrell experience.

At the center of the celebration was sophomore Dalton Lake, who

received all three Sacraments of Initiation. As Bishop Whalen poured holy water over his head during the Rite of Baptism, the gymnasium erupted in a thunderous standing ovation. The spontaneous outpouring of support and love from his classmates was an unforgettable moment that captured the spirit of Farrell unity, pride, and brotherhood.

Reflecting on the ceremony, Dalton

shared that getting baptized felt like a fresh start. “I was nervous at first,” he admitted, “but hearing all of my Farrell brothers cheering for me made me feel like I really belong. This was one of the best days of my life,” said Dalton.

The students were prepared through our *Faithful Men Program* under the guidance of our Director of Campus Ministry Mr. Rich Scafuri '99, a devoted Farrell alumnus who walked with each young man throughout

their journey of faith.

“This is why we do what we do,” said Rich. “To help these young men grow spiritually, to come to know Christ more deeply, and to understand who they are as beloved sons of God.”

In his homily, Bishop Whalen exhorted the newly confirmed and the entire student body to “be the light of the world, to live boldly, love deeply, and serve selflessly in the name of Christ.”

More than a sacramental moment, the Mass was a defining experience for nine Farrell Men and a powerful reminder of Monsignor Farrell High School’s mission, to form men of intellect, faith, and service.

We are incredibly proud of these young men and look forward to witnessing the ways they will continue to lead, inspire, and live out their faith.
